Imposter Syndrome

- 70% of Americans deal with imposter syndrome
 - 1. This syndrome can be defined as someone who is trying to act like or project a life that they know is not who they are and live with a fear that people will discover who they really are.
- Leadership is knowing that the inner scoreboard is better than the outer scoreboard
 - But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." – 1 Samuel 16:7 (NIV)
- If we could give leaders one quality, it would be <u>security</u>

How Do We Help Leaders Who are Dealing with Imposter Syndrome?

- Encourage your leaders to become secure in Psalms 39 and how God created them to be.
- Your authority lies within your authenticity
 - 1. People will not tolerate a fake version of you, but they will tolerate a real and authentic version of you.
- The quickest way to lose influence is to not be aware of it or to downplay it through comparison
- We don't need everyone to be the same we need contrast at the table.

Every Pastor Needs

- A Bible
 - 1. As leaders, we have to devour the Word of God
 - 2. Joshua 1:8
- Honor
 - 1. You teach what you know, and you reproduce who you are
- Excellence







Daily Disciplines

- Bible Reading
 - 1. Kings in the Old Testament were prescribed to read and rewrite the law every day. Doing so would allow their hearts to not be lifted above their brethren.
 - 2. If we fall radically in love with Jesus, he will always bend the arrows of our heart out towards others
 - 3. When I see God, He gives me a burden for others
 - 4. "Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen." 1 John 4:20 (NIV)
- Prayer
 - 1. Prayer brings God-awareness

- We can't just be hearers of the word; we have to be doers.
- Find your group of people and live a devoted life
- A lot of people want fruitfulness without faithfulness
- The concern is that people in the church don't have friends that know Jesus, it's that they have friends that love Jesus.
- We need more time to gather around the table, breaking bread, crying together and strengthen each other's faith.
- "The problem is that most pastors have not cried in front of a small group."

- Leadership is only as lonely as you want it to be.
 - 1. If you want friends, you have to be a friend. If you want authenticity, you have to be authentic.
- What are some symptoms of following Jesus that need to show up in leaders?
 - 1. Believers finding common ground
 - 2. We have more in common than we do in difference
 - 3. "All the believers were together and had everything in common." Acts 2:44 (NIV)
 - 4. If you apply Acts 2:42 you do not carry a haughty spirit, but you go low to find the common ground.
 - 5. We must walk in humility.
