VISION & PURPOSE

The Role of Vision

- Vision is a key factor for healthy and successful churches.
- A study of church leaders showed that every pastor that had vision, or at least thought that they were going to grow, actually did grow.
- Based on this, we want to encourage you to bring vision back into your own heart!

Clarity and Measurable Vision

- To have vision, you also have to have organizational clarity:
 - Know why you exist.
 - Know what you are doing.
 - Know what it should produce.
- From there, you must put language around that vision and make sure it is measurable.
 - At Highlands our vision is based on the Great Commission.
 - Here is the language we use and how we measure it:
 - Know God: How many people are coming to Christ in our churches?
 - Find Freedom: How many people are being pastored in relational groups?
 - <u>Discover Purpose:</u> How many people are on a discipleship process discovering their gifts and developing their disciplines?
 - <u>Make A Difference:</u> How many people are being mobilized into doing something in our communities and in our world that makes a difference?

Vision Within the Calendar

- From there it is important to strategically plan and schedule your church's calendar.
 - Where do we put everything in the calendar year so that we get the most momentum to advance our vision?
- Year after year, it's important to analyze how effective your plan is, tweak it to make it better along the way, and then when you find the best way, stay consistent with it.
- The study shows that leaders that simply believe they can get better and have hope for tomorrow will get this done and live more successful and fulfilled lives.
