Legacy Team: Those who serve on the Dream Team by strategically investing resources over and above their tithe to accelerate the vision of our church.

The Legacy Team doesn’t determine the vision, but they do determine the speed.

Starting a Legacy Team:

Invite people with the gift of giving to join.

- Let them self-identify (during the Growth Track)
- Take the median income in your community and add 30% to it. Take the total number times 10%, and that could give you a baseline of the over and above giving in your church.

Create Legacy Lanes for the different areas of vision.

- Everyone has a passion point

Give them “Vision Gap” updates.

- What we could do if....

Show them ways they can participate in a Lane other than giving.

- Connect them to moments – ex. mission trip to see the difference they are making.

- Other examples: touring new facilities, lunches PC, showing them the “behind-the-scenes”

Build relationship with them.

The 5 Legacy Lanes:

1. Church of the Highlands Projects

Who: For those with a heart to build their church.

Goal: To keep building at the pace of our growth.

2. Highlands College (Next Gen)

Who: For those who love investing in young leaders.

Goal: Building an accredited top-tier Christian College raising up generations of leaders impacting the world for Christ.

3. Local Missions

Who: For those with a heart for the hurting in our own cities.

Goal: To reach the poor and oppressed through the local church and ministry partnerships.

4. National Missions

Who: For those who believe the local church is the hope of America.

Goal: To plant and strengthen the local church.

5. Global Missions

Who: For those who love the world.

Goal: To invest in strategic missions and unreached people.
